## 1. Union School IMPACT OF CUTS

Both Kelly and Maria-Luiza participated at the 2013 PSAC Advanced Union School. Participants of **Union Works for Women** were divided in teams which, along with participating on several interesting workshops, worked on a project of their choice. Our team chose the theme **Impact of Cuts**. It was decided we would present a dramatization on the impact of cuts under two different aspects: **Members** and **Services**, with the last part being presenting **Solutions** to the problems we face. For that, some sugestions were:

# 2. PSAC Equity Conferences - Nov 2013 Okanagan Womens Committee and Okanagan Human Rights Committee presence

The Committee discussed the possibility of having a table/booth during the 2013 PSAC Equity Conferences. That would display our involvement and work on women and human rights issues. The Committee hopes to raise some money for activities throughout the sales of buttoms and tickets for a raffle of a quilt. Kelly will look for information on the possibility of having the table/booth.

#### 3. Quilt project

#### **HUMAN RIGHTS THROUGH THE EYES OF OUR CHILDREN**

The goal of the project is to encourage PSAC members to create awareness on Human Rights (HR) issues, by talking about that to our children.

The group discussed the logistics for the making of a quilt, which would stamp an interpretation of a human right, drawn by children, in each block of the quilt. Maria-Luiza will buy fabrics and permanent markers and will prepare the fabric blocks for drawings. The blocks, markers and an explanation on the project, with links to websites of institutions promoting and defending human rights will be distributed to members, who will then teach HR to their children.

The expectation is for the quilt to be ready in the Fall, for a raffle during the 2013 PSAC Equity Conferences (see item 2).

## 4. Impact of cuts on the Public Service Future of the PSAC Okanagan Human Rights Committee

The Committee discussed the impact of cuts and the changes in our structure if PSAC members who are affected/surplussed could not continue performing their work with the Union. The effects of that for the PSAC Okanagan Human Rights Committee would be devastanting; the Committee would become unviable due to the loss of its membership.

### 5. Guest speaker: Ruy Romano (AGRU Human Rights Committee - BC rep)

#### 5.1 Visibility of the AGRU Human Rights Committee

Ruy talked about the discussions carried over the AGRU Human Rights Committee meeting, held in Ottawa this week. The representatives of the AGRU Human Rights Committee will be looking into ideas on how to make their Committee more visible for the membership. Ruy's suggestions to his Committee were:

- linking the AGRU HR Committee with the need of communities, through the AGRU Social Justice Fund
- presence in the 2014 AGRU Convention by presenting their work to AGRU members through discussion panels, posters, etc.
- having a guest speaker on HR for the AGRU Convention.
